Subject – Monitoring of delay in filing of SLPs/Appeals by the department before the Hon'ble Supreme Court / High Courts. – reg.

It is informed that as per the recommendations made by the Committee of Secretaries (Cos) in its meeting dated 15.09.2016 on the subject "Removing delays in filing of SLPs/Appeals" and as requested by the Law Secretary vide its letter dated 07.11.2016, Commissioner, Directorate of Legal Affairs (DLA) has been made Nodal Officer for CBEC to oversee and monitor cases before the High Courts/Supreme Court.

- 2.0 It is pertinent to mention here that CBEC has already issued its Standard Operating Procedures (SoP) in litigation matters and the same is also hosted at department's website. Annexures 1 and 3 to the said SoP provide/recommend timelines, respectively, for filing Civil Appeals / SLPs in the Supreme Court and Appeals in the High Courts.
- 3.0 At <u>Para-7</u> of the minutes of the meeting (CoS) dated 15.09.2016, *supra*, Department of Legal Affairs (DoLA) has suggested timelines for filing SLP, which are as under :-
 - Examination and taking Administrative decision by the Ministries/Department –
 15 days.
 - Examination and advice/opinion by the DoLA and Law officers 15 days.
 - Drafting of SLP and forwarding the same to the concerned department 15 days.
 - Approval of the draft SLP by the concerned departments and providing necessary documents – 5 days.
 - Preparing paper book and filing 10 days.

(Total - 60 days)

No such timelines have been suggested by the DoLA for filing Civil Appeals (CA) and Appeals in the High Courts.

4.0 Accordingly, timelines provided in the Standard Operating Procedures (SoP) of CBEC for filing of SLPs and Civil Appeals have been revised and approved by the competent authority, which are as under:-

Zonal Chief Commissioners are requested to submit detailed statement of the days involved at each stage in cases where filing of Appeals in the High Courts are delayed. The said delay statement should be shown to and concurrence thereon be taken from the Chief Commissioner.
